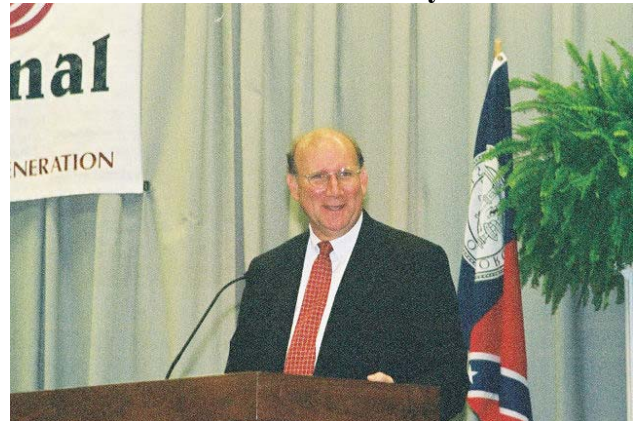

HURRICANE CHARLEY WREAKS HAVOC IN FLORIDA

Extensive damage was done in Punta Gorda and central Florida. The Punta Gorda Church of the Nazarene is a total loss and many people in the congregation lost everything. Other churches reporting damage included Port Charlotte, Fort Myers First, Fort Myers Palm Beach Boulevard, Englewood and Arcadia First. Many other churches were without utilities and many Florida residents lost their homes or continue to be without power.

Relief efforts began immediately, according to Nazarene Disaster Response field director Jim Morsch. Distribution centers were established in the Fort Myers, Punta Gorda, Port Charlotte, Orlando and Apopka areas where care kits are being

distributed to hurricane survivors. Members of the Fort Pierce First Church of the Nazarene, Rev. Ted Underwood, pastor, collected supplies and provided relief to Lake Placid and Punta Gorda which included canned goods, juice, bread, power tools and water.

Buddy Williams, an uncle of Rev. Jeff Hines, Sharpsburg, lost his life when he suffered a heart attack during Charley's move through Punta Gorda. According to Rev. Hines, his uncle was attempting to cover a window which the hurricane had blown out when he suffered the massive attack. Rev. Hines stated his parents, Rev. and Mrs. Ray Hines, lived next door to his uncle and had some damage to their home also.
